Eligibility

- 1. Minimum of 2.0 Average in core Academic and Conduct (e.g. Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies)
- All effort grades in core academic classes must be a "2" or higher
- 3. No more than 10 unexcused absences will be allowed from the previous year
- 4. Placement is based on audition/interview results
- In addition to the Magnet Application, parents must contact the school by January 15th to schedule auditions/ interviews

How to Apply

Admission to José de Diego Middle School is determined by a portfolio review.

Parents must contact the school directly for entrance requirements and to schedule a portfolio interview.

Transportation is limited and may not be available to all students. The magnet lead teacher can assist in determining if a student is eligible for transportation.
